Dear Parents/ Carers

## **Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability**

From 2015 all schools in Australia (government, independent and Catholic) will participate in a process of data collection for students with a disability. This initiative which has been trialled for the past two years is known as the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data for School Students with Disability. The meaning of the word disability for the purposes of this data collection process is derived from the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and has a broad meaning. It includes, for example, the presence in the body of organisms causing disease or illness and also the existence of a disorder or malfunction that results in a person learning differently.

The purpose of collecting this information is to ensure that all stakeholders have a clear picture of the number and level of adjustments that are required so that students with a disability can fully participate in education. Ultimately, this information will provide us with a very clear understanding of what support schools need and what support teachers need to ensure all children are successful.

## **Road Safety Around Our School And What You Can Do To Help**

As many of you are aware the roads around our school are very busy and with 800 students entering and exiting our school every day it is vital that we work together to ensure that our students remain safe.

The school has recently formed a Road Safety Working Party. The aim of this working party is to ensure that as a community we have taken all the steps necessary to keep our children safe. This includes some of the following actions:

- Working with teachers to improve what we do in the classroom with regards to road safety education and more publicly promoting the great work already done;
- Using the newsletter and other modes of communication to conduct parent education to ensure that all parents understand the unique risks associated with children under the age of 12;
- Engaging the local police and rangers to more regularly enforce the traffic and parking rules;
- Liaising with council and the RMS to discuss possible engineering solutions that may make our local roads and foot paths safer; and
- Promoting fun ways to engage and encourage the local community to participate in more sustainable methods of travelling to school.

I encourage anyone interested in joining this working party to email me at the email address above. This week's road safety tip (see below) has been taken from the KidSafe NSW website.

## **Road Safety Tip**

Although children may think they can handle crossing a road by themselves, remember that children:

- are easily distracted and focus on only one aspect of what is happening;
- are smaller and harder for drivers to see;
- are less predictable than other pedestrians;
- cannot accurately judge the speed and distance of moving vehicles;
- cannot accurately predict the direction sounds are coming from;
- are unable to cope with sudden changes in traffic conditions;

- do not understand abstract ideas - such as road safety;
- are unable to identify safe places to cross the road; and
- tend to act inconsistently in and around traffic.

Many children below the age of 10 years do not have the capability or judgment to handle many pedestrian situations. Children need to be accompanied and closely supervised by a parent or adult carer to keep them safer.

Parents and caregivers have a key role in educating their children about road safety. Children learn about road safety largely by experience. Parents and adult carers have opportunities in day-to-day routines to discuss road safety with children on the way to the newsagent, local shop or going to school. Whenever crossing roads, it is an idea to talk about when and why it is safe to cross the road with your children so they can gain a good understanding of road safety issues.

### Lost Property

With 800 students enrolled in our school, returning lost property to students can become a significantly time consuming task. The following procedures are currently in place:

- Lost property when found is taken to the Lost Property Bay on the ground floor of the Pacific Building next to the Uniform Shop. The exception to this is small or valuable items. These items are taken to the school office;
- Lost property is cleared on a regular basis (usually weekly or fortnightly);
- All items in lost property which are clearly labelled (this also includes non-uniform items) are sorted, folded and sent over to the school office for redistribution to its rightful owner;
- Non school uniform clothing items (which aren't named) are dropped off at the second hand store known as Vinnie's on Bay Road;
- School uniform items which are not clearly named and are in good condition are placed in the second hand uniform cupboards;
- All other items are placed in the school skip or dropped off at Vinnie's.

Please help us with this process by clearly labelling your child's belongings. If you would like to volunteer to support the school with this task please contact me via email.

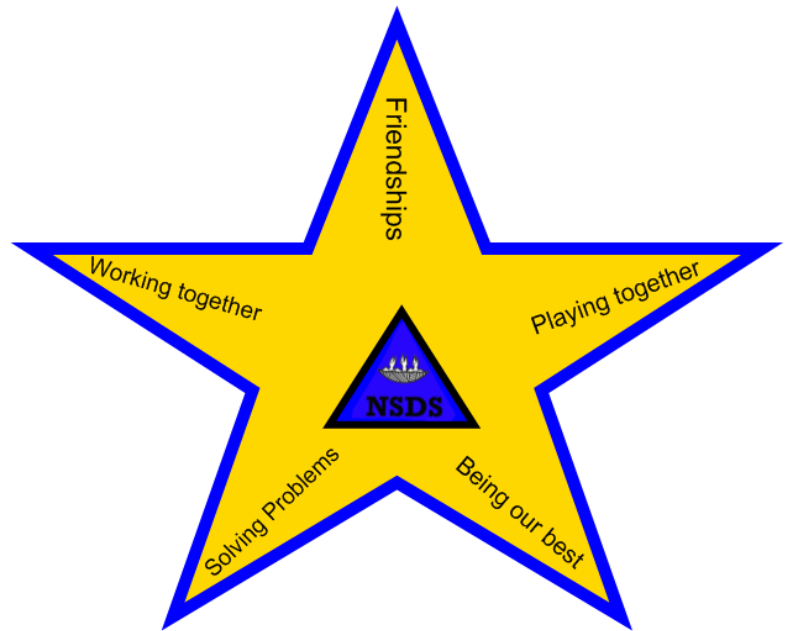

## Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability

### Background to the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability

---

In May 2013, all Education Ministers from Commonwealth, state and territory governments endorsed the implementation of a nationally consistent collection of data on school students with disability in all Australian schools (government, independent and Catholic).

The nationally consistent approach to data collection will provide all Australian schools, education authorities and the community with a clear picture of the number of students with disability in schools and the adjustments they are provided to enable them to participate in education on the same basis as other students.

The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (the national data collection) is being phased in over a three year period. The first limited data collection occurred in October 2013 and the second in August 2014. Selected schools in Australia were chosen to participate in the 2013 and 2014 data collections.

From 2015, all Australian schools will participate in the NCCD, with the first comprehensive collection occurring in August 2015.

### Authority for the collection of information for the purposes of the NCCD

---

The *Australian Education Regulation 2013* (the Regulation) ([www.comlaw.gov.au/Details/F2014L01723](http://www.comlaw.gov.au/Details/F2014L01723)) requires the operators of government and non-government schools (approved authorities) to provide information to the Australian Government Department of Education and Training (the department) for the purposes of the NCCD.

The information that approved authorities must give to the department is set out at subsection 58A(2) of the Regulation. This includes, in relation to each student with a disability at a school operated by the approved authority:

- the student's level of education (i.e. primary or secondary)

- the student's category of disability (i.e. physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional)
- the student's level of adjustment (i.e. support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive adjustment).

The information **will not identify individual students** (subsection 58A(3) of the Regulation); no information that could reasonably enable the department to identify individual students will be provided by approved authorities to the department<sup>1</sup>.

Other details about the information to be collected and the format in which the information is to be provided to the department, will be contained in guidelines approved by the Education Council (the committee of the Council of Australian Governments comprising the Commonwealth and state and territory Ministers responsible for education). The NCCD guidelines for the 2015 data collection are expected to be finalised by May 2015 and will be available on the department's website.

### **Collection and disclosure of school level information**

---

The information collected by schools for the purposes of the 2015 national data collection will ultimately be provided to the department. In some cases this will involve the school passing the data directly to the department and in other cases the school will provide the data to its state and territory government agency or other relevant body, depending on the school's particular arrangements. The state and territory government agency or other body will further de-identify school level data, and may aggregate the data at the state and territory level, before providing the data to the department.

The department, on behalf of the Joint Working Group<sup>2</sup>, will use the information collected for the purposes of preparing reports for and briefing the Australian Education, Early Childhood Development and Youth Senior Officials Committee and the Education Council in relation to the NCCD. For the purposes of preparing these reports or briefing

<sup>1</sup> In the event that NCCD information given by an approved authority to the department does indirectly enable the department to reasonably identify an individual, the disclosure of that information by the approved authority, and the collection of that information by the department, are both authorised by law for the purposes of the *Privacy Act 1988* (Cth). Nevertheless, the department will seek to de-identify NCCD information that inadvertently contains identifying information.

material, the department will ensure that the information is aggregated sufficiently so that no student's identity could reasonably be ascertained.

The aggregated information held by the department may also be used as an input to policy development for future funding and other policy requirements as required by the Education Council.

The department will not otherwise disclose any personal information to third parties, including overseas recipients, without consent or unless authorised or required by law.

The review is being conducted by an independent research company, ARTD Consultants. This company provides services in evaluating public policy. The review will inform ongoing improvement of SRE and SEE for the Department and providers.


