Help! We have a double payments and refund dilemma

Each term the school sends out a Schedule of Payments invoicing families for excursions, books and activities. Then during the Term permission notes for these excursions and activities are also sent home with a request that the note be signed and returned along with payment.

Fortunately, many families pay the full amount detailed on the Schedule of Payments when it arrives (and we thank you for that!).

Unfortunately, though many families forget they have already made this payment and therefore pay again for the excursion/activity when the permission note is sent home.

At the moment NSW Public schools are currently in the process of changing their finance software to a single integrated system that will maintain all the information and (hopefully) allow schools to pick up overpayments before they happen. Until this system is up and running however, the school still needs to write and issue a cheque for every overpayment.

As a significant level of overpayments and refunds are occurring, I would like to ask for your assistance to resolve the problem. Upon receipt of an excursion note and before making payment could you please refer to your schedule of payments and check that the amount has not already been paid. The office staff has assured me that they would prefer that you phone them and make a payment enquiry rather than pay twice and require a refund. The office can be contacted on 9955 2822. Thank you for your help.

Is English an additional language for you?

If English is not your first language and you would like support from the school with regards to communication please be aware of the following school initiatives:

- Isabella Kim has been appointed as our Community Engagement Officer for Semester One and will be available on Monday mornings this Term from 8:30- 9:30 a.m. outside the office to help those parents requiring assistance with forms or notes.
- An Information Evening will be held On Monday 7 March at 6:00pm in the School Library for parents who have English as an additional language. Information will be provided on the following topics:
 - Your child's English learning at school;
 - Supporting your child at home with English;
 - Getting help filling out notes and forms;
 - Communicating with teachers;
 - Bilingualism and language development;
 - Books in different languages in the school library.
- Translation is available in School Stream for parents whose first language is not English. You just need to select your language of choice in the Settings Option and School Stream will translate all of the custom content to help you navigate the app. Please see instructions on page 8 of this Newsletter for more detail. This option will not unfortunately translate any attachments.
- If you are fluent in both English and another language and you are able to translate notes for the school we would like to speak to you about coming to a mutually agreeable arrangement.

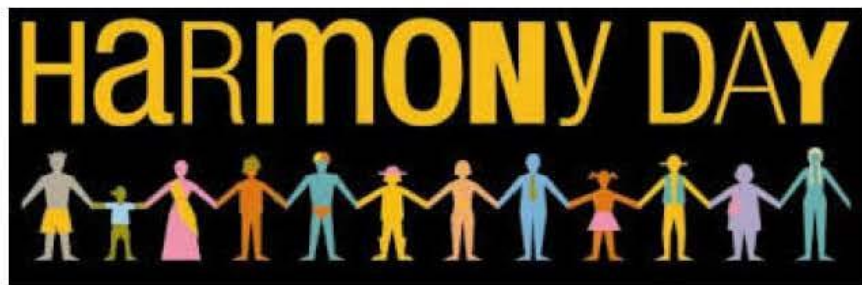

Dear Parents and Carers,

Your child is invited to take part in this year's NSW Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC). This is a program that encourages students to read a wide range of quality literature from a selected list nominated by the NSW premier's office. The list can be found on:

<https://products.schools.nsw.edu.au/prc/booklist/home.html>

What does the challenge involve?

To become involved in the challenge, Kindergarten to year 2 students need to experience **30 books**. Children can read the books on their own or be read to by parents/carers. 25 of these books need to come from the K-2 PRC Reading List (See website above). 5 books can be their own free choice. Students in years 3-6 need to read 20 books of which 15 need to be from the 3-4 and/or 5-6 PRC list and 5 free choice books.

PRC books can be found in our school library and in local council libraries. Students can borrow PRC books in library lessons and parents are welcome to pop in before and after school to assist their child.

In addition, all books can either be read in paper format, on eReaders, Kindles, iPads, or by audio books on CDs, DVDs, iPhones, Smartphones or iPod Touch.

All books need to be read and recorded online by 19 August (11:59 pm). Students will receive a certificate from the PRC team on completion. This year we will be having a book review writing passport and prizes throughout the challenge period. More details will be posted next week.

PRC Certificates will be awarded in December.

How to participate:

Students can begin their reading now and log on from **Monday 7 March**. To log on please go to the PRC website <https://products.schools.nsw.edu.au/prc/home.html>, or Google Premier's Reading Challenge NSW 2016).

Select the "log on" button from the menu on the left of the PRC website.

1. Enter the student's DEC user name and password - this is the same as the one used by students to access the internet at school. **Your child's class teacher will provide your child with a DEC user name and password shortly.**
2. Enter the PRC ID code (found on the reading lists) for each book the student has read. Alternatively you can find the PRC ID code at the back of most of our library books.
3. Please feel free to contact me for any questions. **I will be holding the first information session next Friday 11 March after school at 3:15 pm in the library. Please feel free to come and get your questions answered.**

Would you like to participate in the School P&C?

The P&C needs new members annually

The AGM will be held on Wednesday 9 March in the Library at 6:30pm

The Dem has a large and growing student population - currently over 800 students! A thriving P&C helps us to ensure that our children get the equipment, facilities and support that they need.

Your active involvement in our school lets your child/children know how much you value their education. If you would like to learn more, be involved and/or influence the outcomes at the school, please consider putting yourself forward for one of the office bearer or sub-committee roles on the P&C, or simply volunteer to help at P&C events or services.

We want to have an inclusive, strong and supportive P&C to assist the continued growth of a vibrant and thriving school community. We all have skills to contribute to the P&C and the school!

Who is the P&C?

The P&C is an incorporated entity which operates in partnership with the school in order to provide selected services, hold community events and contribute to projects that promote the interests of the school community.

- Services provided include the Tuck Shop and the Uniform Shop.
- Events held include the Welcome and End of Year BBQs, Spellathon etc.
- Some of the recent P&C partnership initiatives with the school include:
 - Additional Smartboards (this year 3 extra boards were provided in classrooms);
 - Pacific playground shade structure;
 - Artificial grass surfacing for the Haven area;
 - Little Equipment refurbishment;
 - Upper Pacific playground;
 - Increased support for the joint "Educational Initiatives" programme that will ensure that the school maintains the language and other programmes.

How is the P&C funded?

The P&C is funded by a combination of voluntary parent contributions, fund raising and grants.

When does the P&C meet?

Generally every 2nd Wednesday of the month in the school library from 6:30pm.

What is the P&C structure and what roles exist?

The P&C has a number of executive roles that are needed to operate as an entity. Without them, services such as the Tuck Shop and Uniform Shop could not be provided by the P&C and would end up being outsourced.

The P&C constitution limits office bearer roles to a two year term, which means that the P&C needs new members annually.

The P&C Constitution requires that the following office bearer roles be filled:

1 x President : The President is responsible for the successful functioning of the P&C including chairing meetings; ensuring that the P&C properly takes part in decision-making processes in the school; and acting as the P&C's spokesperson at public events and with school.

2 x Vice Presidents: The role of the Vice Presidents is to support the President and other committee members. It is a role that is ideally shared between two people. Duties include assisting with events being organised by sub-committees; taking on independent projects as required; attending the P&C & Executive meetings; and taking minutes in the absence of the Secretary. The Vice President may be called upon to relieve the P&C President at meetings or events if needed.

1 x Treasurer: The Treasurer receives and deposits monies, maintains records, draws cheques and presents accounts. The Treasurer also ensures that all funds held and handled by P&C are properly and openly accounted for as the Treasurer is responsible for all funds held in the name of the P&C Association. This includes all P&C Association committees.

1 x Secretary: The Secretary prepares, in consultation with the President, all meeting agendas; attends P&C meetings, manages correspondence and writes & distributes the Minutes of the meetings; and maintains official records of the P&C.

The P&C also has a number of sub-committees:

Tuck Shop: This role provides oversight of the Tuck Shop business. Ideally two people should be assigned to this role.

Uniform Shop: This role provides oversight of the Uniform Shop business. Ideally two people should be assigned to this role.

Fundraising: This role leads the P&C funding activities. The P&C usually holds four community fundraising events per year.

Compliance: This role ensures that the P&C is operating within the required legal and compliance frameworks.

Communication: This role ensures that the P&C is communicating activities to the school community.

Environment & Grant Management: This role looks for opportunities to improve the school environment by managing grant applications that have been identified appropriate for the school.

3. Under Edit/Alerts select My Schools and select your School to open the Notifications page
4. Toggle notifications on or off individually (e.g. Alerts, Events, Newsletters, etc.)
5. When you have finished, use the Back button to return to the Settings page, then select Done to return to your School
