Launching Walk-2-School Program

On Monday 20 June we will launch a walk-to-school initiative in conjunction with The Bicycle Network. This program, known as the **Active Paths** initiative, is about making it easier for students that want to walk, scoot or skate to school.

Active Paths are designated routes to school that have been identified in conjunction with the local council and the school community. The paths were selected based on locally identified features such as:

- The most direct route;
- Locality of good pedestrian infrastructure; and
- Walkable catchments to the school.

Our 10 student executives have worked with a representative from the Bicycle Network to determine the best routes for our school population based on our recorded addresses for students. These routes are designed to make the journey as clear, popular and fun as possible and will allow all students to actively travel at least part of the way on their journey to school.

On the day of the launch we encourage parents to either drop off (Years 3-6) or accompany their child to one of the four starting points at 8:30am (see map on page 3). Students (and parents if K-2) are then encouraged to walk together to school. At school they will be greeted with a sticker celebrating this new initiative. A whole school assembly will then be held where the program will be explained in more detail. While there will be either a staff or Bicycle Network representative participating on the launch day, **this walking route will not be supervised on other regular school days** and therefore may not be appropriate for unaccompanied children in Years K-2.

We look forward to celebrating a more active and healthy student population and a quieter and safer McHatton Street and Bay Road as a result of this program.

Road Safety around The Dem

Safety concerns are continuing to be raised by our community in response to unsafe driver and pedestrian behaviour on McHatton Street. Please keep our children safe by adhering to the following requests:

- Only allow your child to exit the car on the southern curbside of McHatton Street. Children should not be exiting the car onto the road or crossing the road in front of, or behind, your car as this may be in a blind spot for oncoming cars.
- If there is not a car spot available, continue driving around the block. Do not double park while waiting for another driver to complete the parking of their car as this creates a dangerous backlog and additional blind spots for pedestrians.
- Park on the roadside and according to the signage. It is not legal to park in local resident's driveways.
- Continue to drive in the same direction. Going around the block is safer than three point turns.





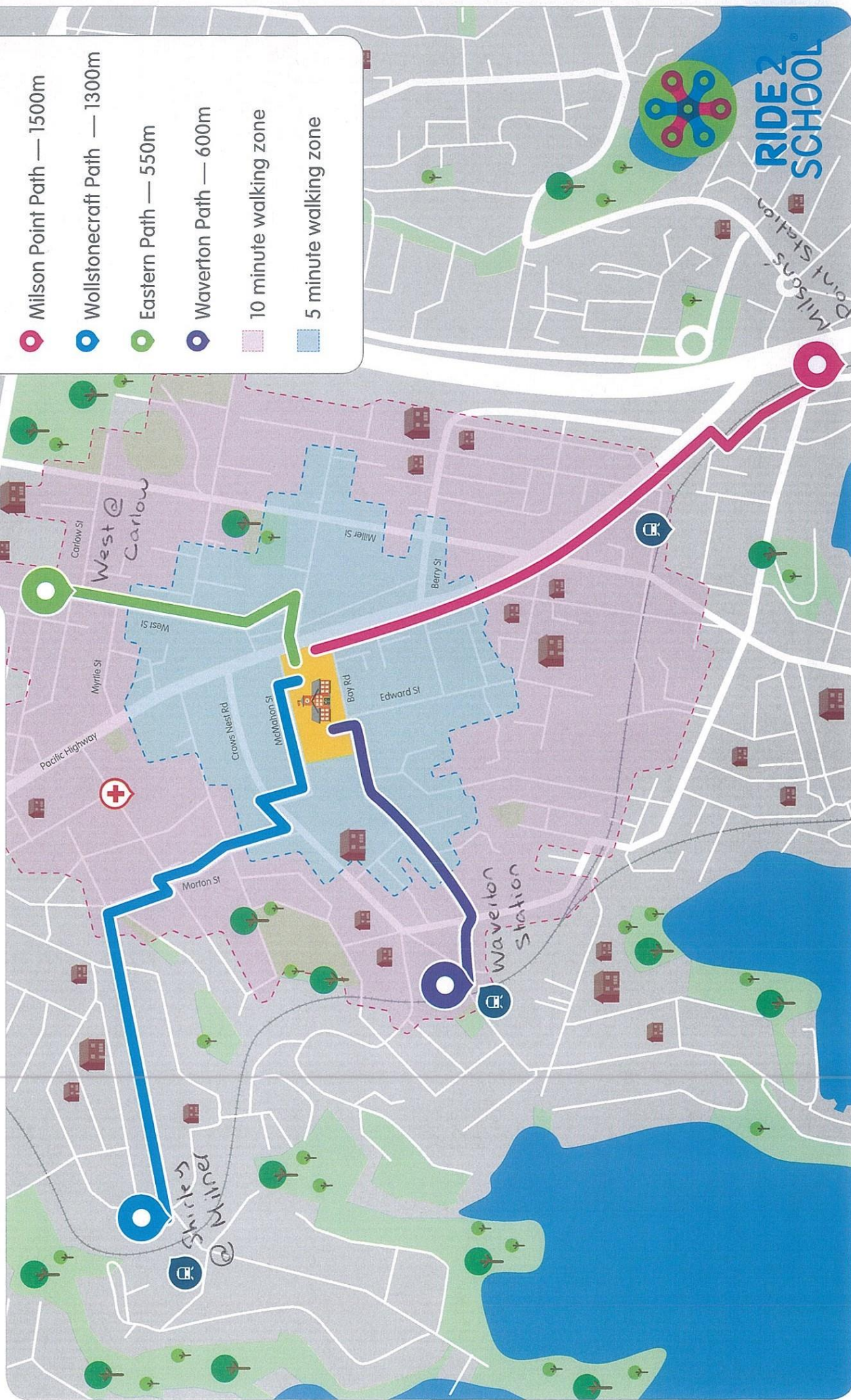

Tips for riding and walking

Be alert on paths

When riding and walking look for:

- Other path users
- Dogs or other animals
- Driveways, laneways or other crossings
- Path obstacles, such as pot-holes, change of surface, sharp or blind corners

Riding on paths

- Keep to the left on the path
- Let others know you are approaching by ringing your bell or calling out
- Don't ride too fast or act unexpectedly
- Give way to pedestrians
- Obey signs
- Ride side-by-side only when path is wide enough to give way to oncoming bikes and pedestrians

When passing driveways

- Children need to learn to be aware of reversing cars
- Children's peripheral vision is not fully developed until around the age of 10, so it's important to encourage them to turn their head to look at driveways
- Remind them to watch out at each driveway and stop out of the way of reversing cars

When crossing roads

Stop, look, listen, think when crossing the road.

Ride ready checklist

1. Helmet fit

Does your child's helmet move around when you wiggle it on their head? Can they salute two fingers between their eyebrow and helmet? Adjust to a snug fit.



2. Firm tyres

Fully inflated tyres make riding easier and are more resistant to punctures. Check for the correct tyre pressure on the side of the tyre.



3. Check the brakes

It is important that your child is able to stop quickly. Check that the bike brakes are working before you set off.



4. Check for loose bits and bolts

Have a quick scan for any loose bolts or bits on your child's bike before you set off. This includes bells, racks, bolts or any other attachments.



5. Wiggle the saddle

Your child's saddle is the right height when they can sit and place the balls of their feet on the ground.

Adjust their saddle and tighten so it can't move about while they are riding.



6. Be heard with a bell

All bikes need to have bells. Also teach your child to use their voice to alert others.



7. Be warm and visible

Dress your child in brightly coloured clothing that is weather appropriate.



Active kids are happy kids!

At North Sydney Demonstration School, we support riding and walking to school. Walking and riding to school helps kids to achieve their required minimum 60 minutes of physical activity per day.

Active kids are happier, more socially connected and arrive at school ready to learn.

We designed this map to identify the best part-way drop off points along popular walking and riding routes to school. This will provide all students to have the opportunity to ride or walk to school.

Draw a cross approximately where your home is so that you can work out the best way to walk or ride to school. If you can't ride or walk the whole way, Part Way is OK!

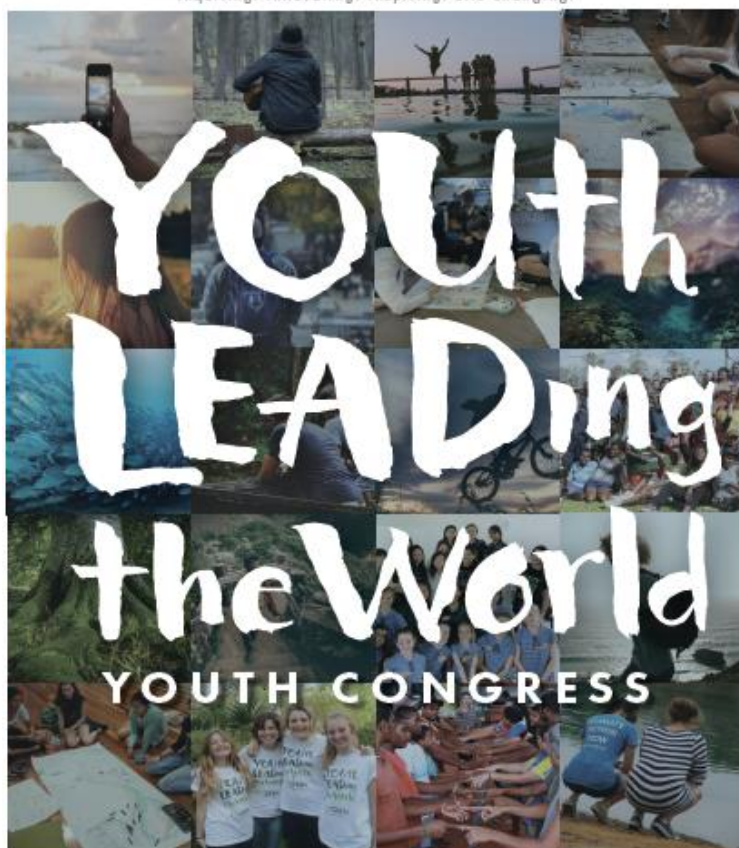

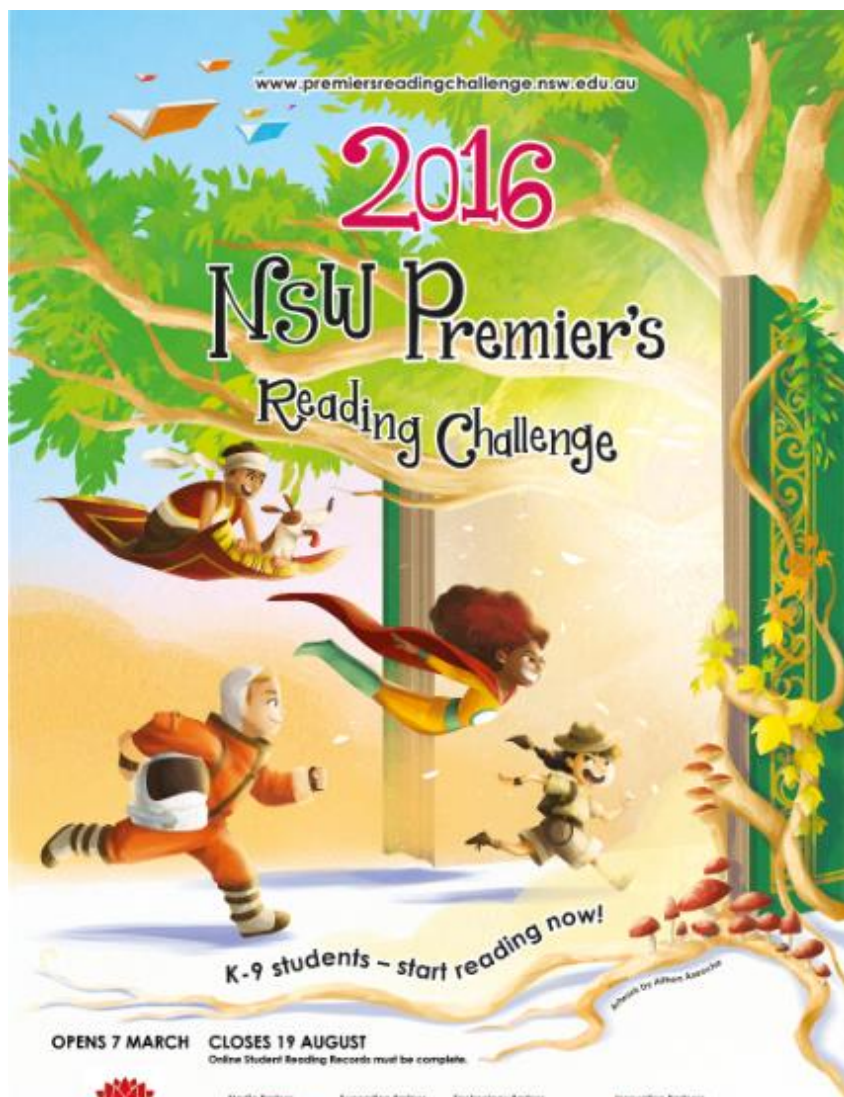
