National Reconciliation Week (27 May to 3 June)

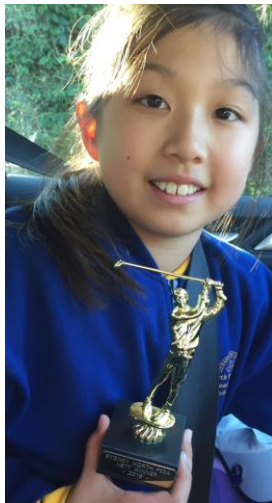

Volunteer Ethics Teachers Needed

Ethics classes are currently an available option for children in Years 4, 5 & 6, currently attending a non-scripture class. In order to extend the option to Year 3 we will need more Ethics Teachers.

Previous experience teaching or working with children is not required, however all volunteers to the program will have to obtain a Working With Children Check via the NSW Office of the Children's Guardian.

Ethics Teachers receive full training by Primary Ethics to deliver a highly structured, age appropriate curriculum once a week. The training consists of a two day workshop and short online modules. Classes run for 30 minutes on Wednesday mornings.

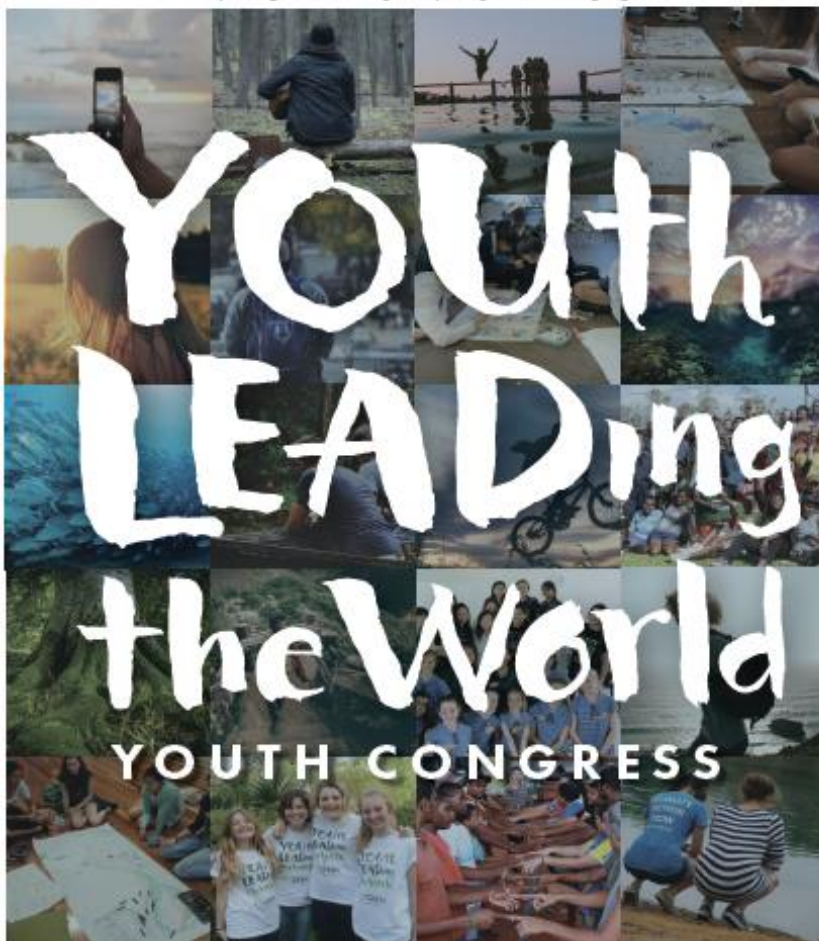

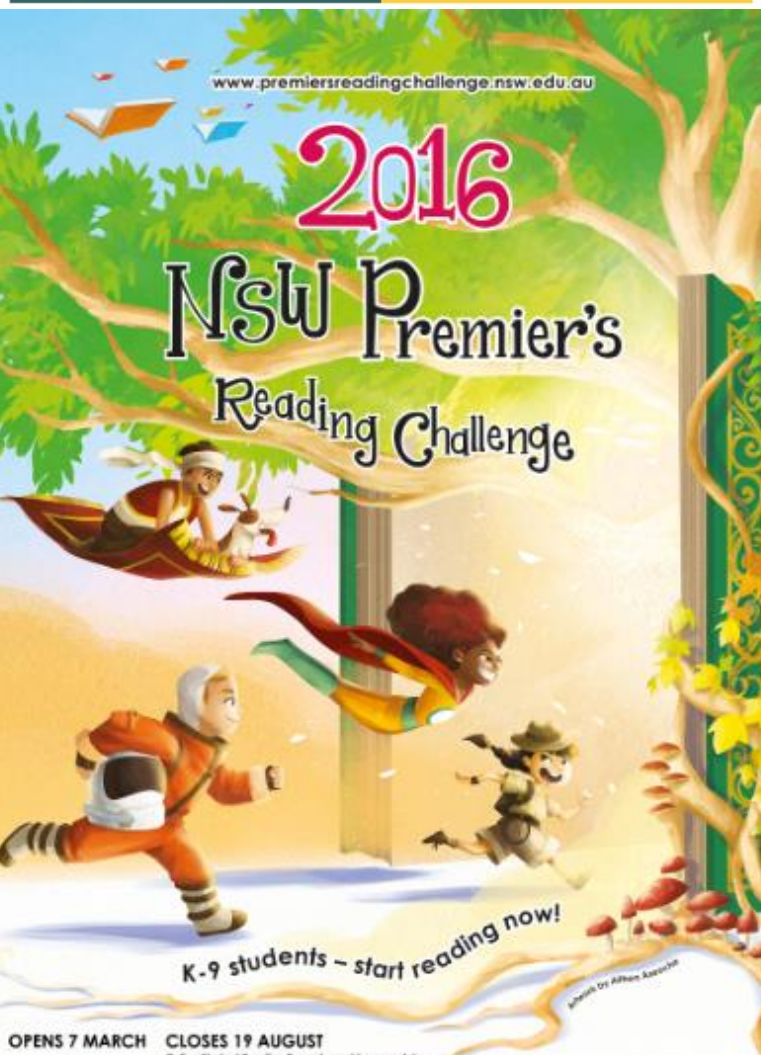

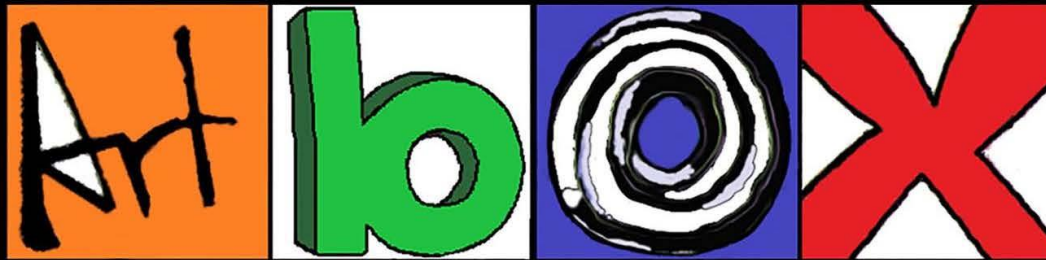
