Swimming Carnival

Tuesday was a beautiful day to be poolside while 230 North Sydney Dem students participated in one or more races at the swimming carnival. Scripture Program

Scripture classes commenced this week. Your child's scripture group is as nominated by you at the time of enrolment. Students who do not attend a scripture class are placed in a non-scripture group where they will read, complete homework or engage in activities that revise already taught concepts. In the event that a scripture teacher is unavailable your child will also attend non-scripture. Students will not be able to change scripture classes without a valid reason being provided by their parent. Unfortunately, due to large student numbers, the sampling of multiple scripture classes throughout the year is not possible.

Ethics Program

Ethics is offered as an alternative to non-scripture and has been available to students at the Dem for the past 7 years. There has been a lot of interest in Ethics classes, however while the demand is high, the number of Ethics teachers available across grades is low. As such, the program has needed to be reassessed in 2019 and we cannot guarantee placements for existing Ethics students. All students interested in participating with Ethics will need to complete an Expression of Interest form (see page 10 of this newsletter) and will go into a ballot. Allocation of Ethics classes will be determined by the availability of volunteer teachers on each grade/stage. If Ethics is possible in your child's grade, interested/eligible students will be chosen by ballot. To be eligible students must currently be enrolled in non-scripture. Ethics classes should be able to commence on Wednesday 6 March.

Could you be an Ethics Teacher for North Sydney Demonstration School

Ethics classes are run by volunteers working with Primary Ethics, the not-for-profit organization approved by the Department of Education to run the Ethics Program in NSW primary schools. The program depends on volunteers and we are regularly recruiting ethics teachers. Please consider whether you or someone you know would be interested in volunteering. Suitable volunteers have an interest in children's education and development of critical thinking skills and must be available to take a 45 minute class on Wednesday mornings each week. Ethics Teachers receive full training by Primary Ethics and classes and follow an approved curriculum. In Ethics classes, children learn how to think logically, disagree respectfully and support their arguments with evidence, rather than act according to blind habit or peer pressure. Creative Arts Programs - 2019

If your child would like to become involved in one of the creative arts programs at our school please read the explanation detailed below on how to apply:

1. Students can be accepted into a Creative Arts Program in 3 ways:
 - a. A successful audition (*limited places*), or
 - b. A priority ballot for students who have **not** already been in 2 or more creative arts programs in the last 2 years, or
 - c. A **possible** final general ballot for students who **have** been in 2 or more creative arts programs in the last 2 years. This ballot will only be run if there are still places available in the program.
2. Please note that a number of places in each Creative Arts Program have been reserved for students who are successful through an audition process. This will ensure that students who are gifted and talented in the creative arts have the same opportunity to be extended in their area of talent as students who are gifted in other areas such as academic fields and sport.
3. Our Creative Arts Groups for 2019 are:
 - a. Choir (K-2, Stage 2 and Stage 3);
 - b. Recorder Ensemble (Years 3 to 6)
 - c. *Annie* the musical (for all grades).
4. Joining the school's band program does not require an audition. This program runs after school for students in Years 3 to 6. If you are interested in joining the band please email kate.crilly@det.nsw.edu.au

ICAS 2019

In 2019 students in Years 2-6 will once again have the opportunity to participate in ICAS testing. ICAS is an independent, skills-based assessment program. It is not compulsory and the results are not part of the North Sydney Demonstration School assessment program. ICAS is run by the University of NSW. In 2019 NSDS will be conducting each of the ICAS tests after school hours during September. We expect that the tests will be completed by approximately 4:30pm on the specified dates. Children will be supervised by NSDS teachers. Please refer to page 9 for more information about the dates of each test and details on how to register. All registrations need to be submitted to the school office and paid for by **Friday 29 March. No late registrations will be accepted.**

Road Safety for School Drop-off and Pick-up

Where circumstances mean that you must drive your child to school please be aware of the high pedestrian and vehicular traffic around the school. Please note that the school carpark, available to staff only, is also a busy place on school mornings.

The school will continue to encourage parking ranger presence in the afternoons and mornings to ensure that dangerous behaviours such as double parking and 3 point turns are discouraged. Driving behaviours being policed include:

- Disobeying No Stopping or No Parking signs;
- Stopping on/near a pedestrian crossing;
- Double parking; and
- Stopping on or across a driveway.

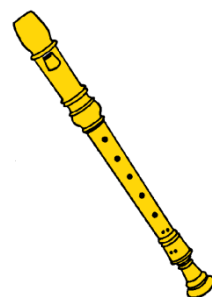

ETHICS CLASSES AT THE DEM

Dear parents and carers,

Ethics classes have been available in NSW public primary schools since 2011 as an option for children who do not attend Special Religious Education (SRE) / Scripture. The NSW government has authorised Primary Ethics, a not-for profit organisation, to design curriculum and deliver these classes. Classes are inquiry based and children use dialogue and discussion to learn how to think about ethical matters through the give-and-take of reasoned argument. Trained and vetted volunteer teachers lead discussions. Currently Ethics classes are run in NSW for students from Years 1 to 6, where volunteer teachers are available.

We are currently assessing demand for Ethics classes at NSDS for 2019. Please advise if you are interested in choosing Ethics for your child by returning the slip below by Monday 25 February.

Allocation of Ethics classes will be determined by the availability of volunteer teachers on each grade/stage. If Ethics is possible on your child's grade, interested/eligible students will be chosen by ballot. To be eligible students must currently be enrolled in non-scripture. Ethics classes should be able to commence on Wednesday 6 March.

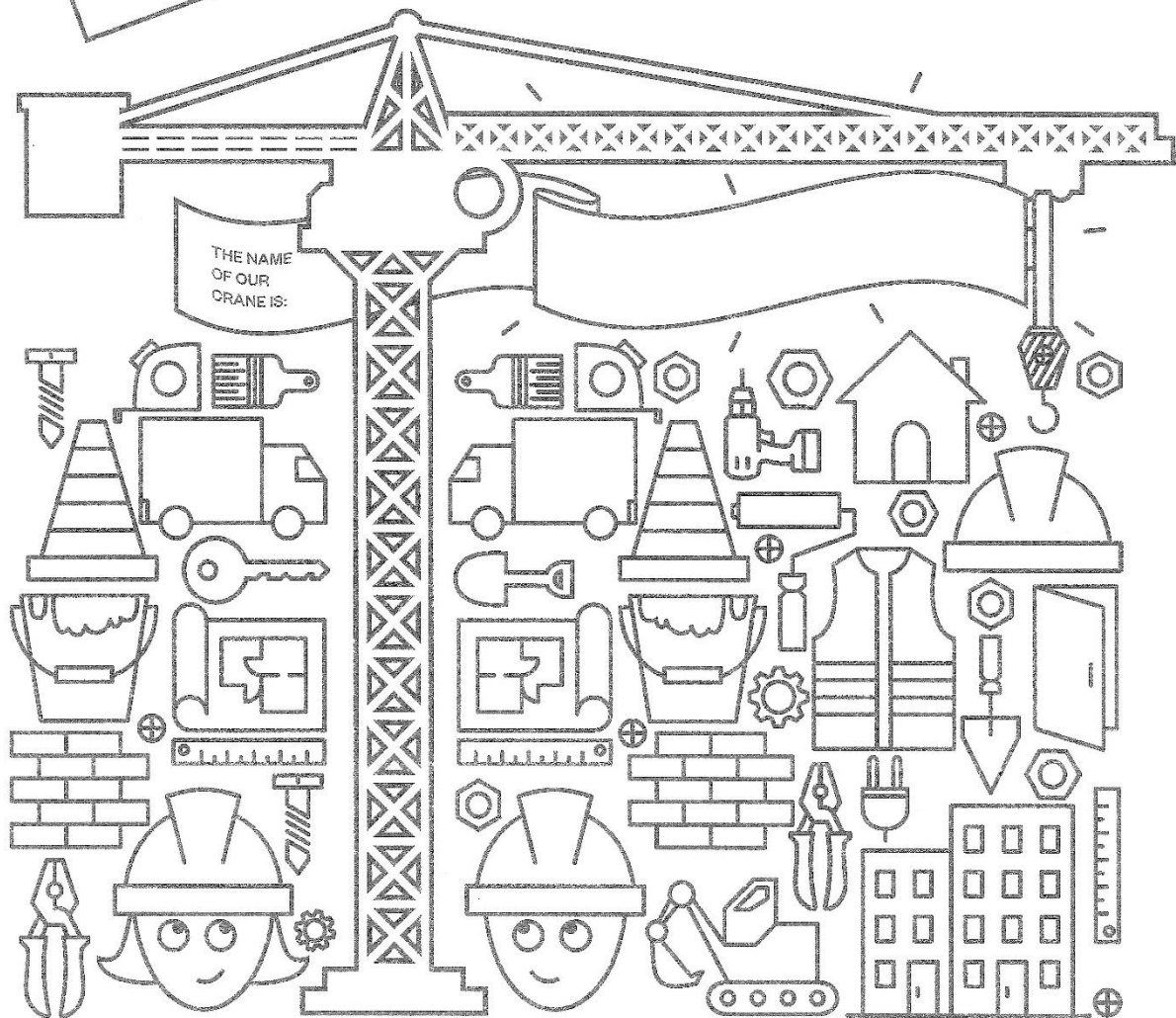

NSW Bus Safety Week

18 - 24 February 2019

Buses are large, heavy vehicles and can't stop quickly. During Bus Safety Week, remember to always:

- Drive safely near school buses:
 - Slow down to 40km/h when bus lights flash.
 - Give way to buses.
 - Watch out for children crossing.
 - Never park in or near a bus stop or bus zone.
 - Don't merge too closely in front of buses.
- Supervise your child until they are at least 10 and hold their hand when walking to and from the bus stop or interchange and when crossing the road.
- Hold hands and wait as far back from the passing traffic as possible, when waiting for the bus.

BE BUS AWARE

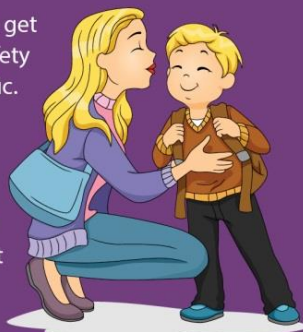
Stay alert and cross with care



- Meet your child at the bus stop. Never meet them on the opposite side of the road and call them across.
- Wait until the bus has gone, at least one step back from the edge of the road, then choose a safe place to cross the road. Remember to Stop! Look! Listen! Think!

Safety tips for school drop-off and pick-up

- **ALWAYS** park safely and legally, even if it means walking further to the school gate.
- **NEVER** double park, stop on the footpath or stop on or across a driveway.
- **ALWAYS** ensure your children get out of the car through the 'Safety Door', away from passing traffic. This is the rear footpath side door of the car.
- **NEVER** call out to your children from across the road – they may run to you without checking for traffic.
- **ALWAYS** stick to the 40km/h speed limit.
- **ALWAYS** give way to pedestrians and stay aware of crossings.
- **NEVER** perform U-turns and three-point turns in school zones.
- If you need to drop-off your children or pick them up quickly, **ALWAYS** do so on the school side of the road in your school's designated drop-off and pick-up area – usually a No Parking or Kiss and Drop zone.
- When picking up your children in the afternoon from the pick-up area, **ONLY** pull into the zone when you see your child waiting on the footpath. Do not queue – drive around the block if need be.

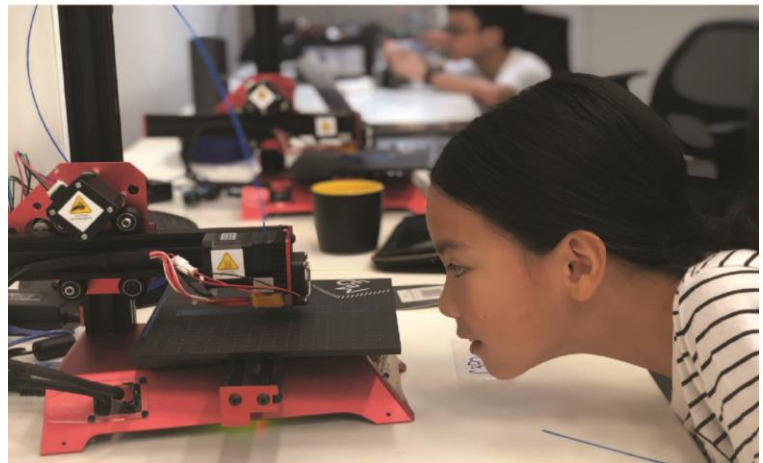

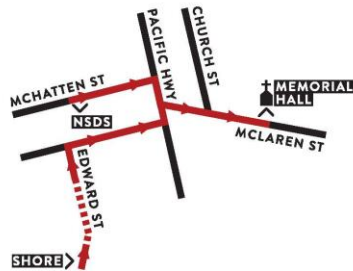
