## NAPLAN Equating Study

North Sydney Dem has been selected by ACARA (Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority) to participate in the 2019 NAPLAN Equating Study. Equating tests have occurred each year since 2009 and each year a different selection of sampled schools is needed. The sample ensures a diverse range of student backgrounds and abilities is represented. The purpose of the equating study is to enable the results for the 2019 NAPLAN tests to be reported on the same common NAPLAN measurement scales.

One Year 3 class and one Year 5 class have been randomly selected to take part in this study. These classes will sit the equating study tests on **Friday 3 May**, prior to the NAPLAN testing dates of **Tuesday 14, Wednesday 15 and Thursday 16 May**. Parents of students in these two classes will receive additional information about their child's participation. # NSW Premier's Reading Challenge 2019

Over 470 Dem students have already started the Premier's Reading Challenge in 2019! Last year we celebrated 529 students completing the challenge. North Sydney Demonstration Public School has participated in the Premier's Reading Challenge for many years. During this time students have been able to read a selection of quality literature. It is not a competition. The challenge encourages students to read for pleasure while being exposed to a wide variety of books in order to foster a lifelong love of reading.

We urge all students K-6 to participate in the challenge. During library lessons students will be encouraged to borrow PRC books.

**K-2 students** will need to read or have a parent read to them a total of 30 books.

**3-6 students** will need to independently read 20 books.

See the instructions below regarding how your child can logon to the NSW PRC website at home and enter in their books.

## How do students log in to the NSW Premier's Reading Challenge website?

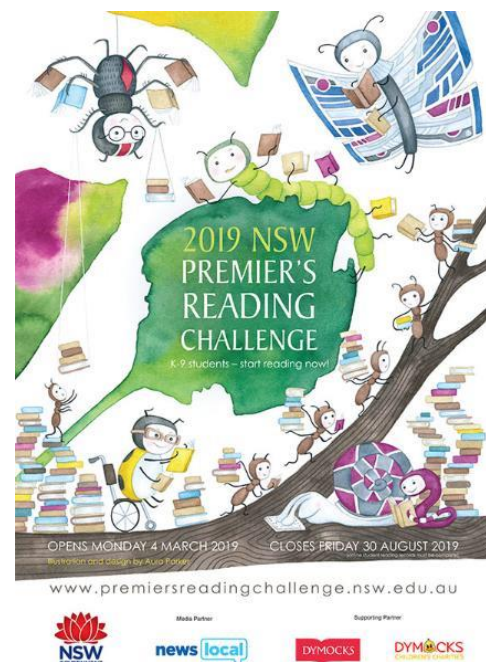
1. Click this link <https://online.det.nsw.edu.au/prc/home.html> it will redirect you to the NSW Premier's Reading Challenge home page.
2. On the PRC website homepage, click on Logon on the menu to login.
3. It will take you to the NSW Department of Education portal login page. Students will need to enter in their username and password here. Your child's teacher can provide user name and password if unknown.
4. Once logged on the page will state 'Personal Reading Record for ...(student's name)...'
5. Click on Student Reading Records (enter book) and you can start adding books.

TIP: If you enter the PRC ID number and press 'add' all the book details will appear. PRC ID numbers can be found on the last page of the book.

The library is open every morning from 8:30-8:55am and after school 2:55-3:15pm. If you need any assistance logging on please pop in and visit. Your child can also visit us at lunch time and our library monitors will help your child enter books. The library is open for K-2 second half play lunch Monday, Wednesday and Friday and 3-6 can visit the library second half play lunch Tuesday and Thursday.

The Premier's Reading Challenge has an exciting new feature that allows students to select a genre they enjoy and will offer a list of books to add to their wish list. Students in 3-6 will be exploring this new PRC experience during their library lessons. Happy Reading!

## **Speech & Language Skills (Kindergarten)**



***Does your child have difficulty with...***

### **LANGUAGE?**

For example:

- Answering wh- questions
- Categorising words according to groups (e.g. animals, food)
- Understanding instructions like "Put the book on the shelf next to the ball"
- Forming grammatically correct sentences
- Understanding and retelling long stories

### **ARTICULATION?**

For example:

- Saying the 'r' and 's' sounds (saying 'thhandwich' instead of 'sandwich' and/ or saying 'wock' instead of 'rock')
- Not being able to say 'th' in Kindy is fine (if it has not been corrected then in Year 2 it requires support)

### **LITERACY?**

For example:

- Identifying corresponding sounds for letters
- Clapping out syllables
- Identifying the first and last sounds in words
- Blending 3 sounds to form words
- Reading simple, common words like 'mum', 'dad', 'if'

*If you have any concerns please speak to your child's teacher.  
They can recommend further support and referral to our learning support team.*



## Reading using the Pause/ Prompt/ Praise strategy :

### Pause

Look and listen for errors which are recurring or interrupt the flow of the text.  
Provide your child with an opportunity to self-correct by:  
Pausing for up to five seconds (count slowly!) **or**  
Waiting until the end of the sentence.

### Prompt

If your child does not self-correct after pausing, you could prompt them to take an action.

*Does that look right?*

*Have a look at the letters in that word again.*

*Look at the letters 'ing', what sound do they make?*

*You have the first and the last sounds correct, look at the middle sound.*

*Does that sound right? (repeat what they read word for word)*

*How would you say it?*

*Does that make sense?*

*What could you try?*

These are common phrases used by class teachers.

If your child is still unsuccessful, tell them the unknown word and read on.

### Praise

Accuracy is important but we want to foster problem solving skills more than anything. Celebrate the mistakes and how your child dealt with them.

Praise frequently and explicitly, stating exactly what they are doing correctly.

*I really liked it when...*

*That was clever how you...*

*That sounded like great reading when...*

Praise when:

Your child reads a previously unknown word correctly.

Your child makes an error but then self-corrects.

Your child reads a word correctly after you have prompted them.

Your child reads fluently and accurately.

### Recapping

Talk about the book after reading to make sure that your child has understood what they have read. Ask about their favourite part or what it reminded them of.

## Sight words:

Help your child build quick recall of high frequency (Golden) words. This will assist with fluent reading and spelling.

Old cereal boxes etc can be cut up into word cards as a budget option.

Hide 10 words around the house and ask your child to find a given word.

Match up- use 10 pairs of word cards face up. Your child tries to read and match the pairs within a time limit.

Snap or memory games.

Bang- each person draws a card and reads it out loud. The aim is to collect the biggest pile before someone draws the 'bang' card.

Stick post it notes with words written on them on a fence. Use them for target practice with a ball or Nerf Gun.

## Writing:

Writing is a complex activity. Consider practicing components separately to keep it enjoyable and successful at home.

### Handwriting activities-

Practice letter formation with fun materials- paint, chalk, water on cement.

Bath crayons at bath time.

Write a mystery letter on a family member's hand or back.

### Spelling:

Spell out a word with magnetic letters.

Hang man or similar.

Bounce a ball or jump on a trampoline. One bounce as you say each letter of a spelling word.

Make words with playdough.

### Writing

Give your child writing for a purpose- shopping lists, cards, memos, text messages, signs or labels are all opportunities for your child to write. Be accepting of your child's attempts of unknown words and solve difficult words together.

Make a book with your child about an outing or dream or particular interest. They can share these books with siblings, grandparents and even their classmates.

## Intention to apply for Year 5 entry to an opportunity class in 2020

Opportunity classes cater for academically gifted and talented students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. These schools help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing educational materials at the appropriate level.

Applications for opportunity class placement are considered mainly on the combined results of the Opportunity Class Placement Test and school assessments. The Opportunity Class Placement Test will be held on **Wednesday 31 July 2019**.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 5 opportunity class entry in 2020, you need to apply soon. You will need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

Detailed instructions on how to apply online will be available from **Tuesday 30 April 2019** at <https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-5>

The application website opens on **Tuesday 30 April 2019** and closes on **Friday 17 May 2019**. You must apply by the due date.

There are no paper application forms. If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Team for assistance after **30 April 2019**.

You must submit only ONE application for each student.

**Remember: The tear-off strip below is not an application and the school cannot apply on your behalf.**
