NAPLAN Week

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) tests are conducted in May each year. Next week students in Years 3 and 5 will all sit their NAPLAN as follows:

- Tuesday 14 May – Language Conventions and Writing tests
- Wednesday 15 May – Reading tests
- Thursday 16 May – Numeracy tests

These tests are conducted during the morning session at school. If your child is in Year 3 or Year 5 it is important that they arrive at school in time for the 8:55am bell and are ready to participate with the rest of their class.

Students who are absent on any of these days will complete a make-up test on Friday 17 May.

Students who are late to school on any of these days will not be able to join their classroom until the NAPLAN tests are complete. This is to ensure that there is no disruption to the rest of the class. Late students will be placed with another year group until they are able to return to their own class later in the day.

Non educational use of Mobile and Smart Devices at School

Thank you to the 70 parents and carers who have already completed the survey and provided the school with feedback about the non-educational use of mobiles and smart devices at school.

On 21 June 2018, the NSW Government called for a review into the use of mobile digital devices, specifically smartphones, in NSW schools. The findings and recommendations of the review were released late in 2018.

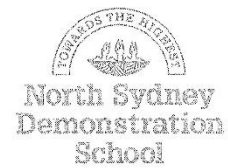

Expression of Interest notes will be available for interested students to collect from the nominated Creative Arts Teacher or at the office.
Step 2	Priority ballot	<p>Students who :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> did not audition or who were unsuccessful at audition, and have not participated in the 2017 musical, or have not participated in 2 or more Creative Arts groups in the past 2 years, <p>may go into the Priority ballot.</p>
Step 3	General ballot	<p>Students who :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> have participated in the 2017 musical, and/or have participated in 2 or more Creative Arts groups in the past 2 years, <p>are restricted to the General ballot which will take place only if spaces are still available after the Priority ballot is drawn.</p>

Walking or riding to and from school with your child helps:

Up until at least **10 years old**, supervise your child very closely, holding their hand when crossing the road.

Key messages for kids to stay safe when walking and riding:

- Stop! Look! Listen! Think! every time you cross a road or driveway.
- Stay alert, look up – don't get distracted by your phone.
- Use pedestrian crossings where possible.
- Always wear a helmet when riding a bike, scooter or skateboard.
- Take extra care around trucks and buses – they can't always see you.

If you are driving, always look out for people walking or riding. And remember: slow down to 40 when bus lights flash.

NSW Premier's Reading Challenge 2019

Over 470 Dem students have already started the Premier's Reading Challenge in 2019! Last year we celebrated 529 students completing the challenge. North Sydney Demonstration Public School has participated in the Premier's Reading Challenge for many years. During this time students have been able to read a selection of quality literature. It is not a competition. The challenge encourages students to read for pleasure while being exposed to a wide variety of books in order to foster a lifelong love of reading.

We urge all students K-6 to participate in the challenge. During library lessons students will be encouraged to borrow PRC books.

K-2 students will need to read or have a parent read to them a total of 30 books.

3-6 students will need to independently read 20 books.

See the instructions below regarding how your child can logon to the NSW PRC website at home and enter in their books.

How do students log in to the NSW Premier's Reading Challenge website?

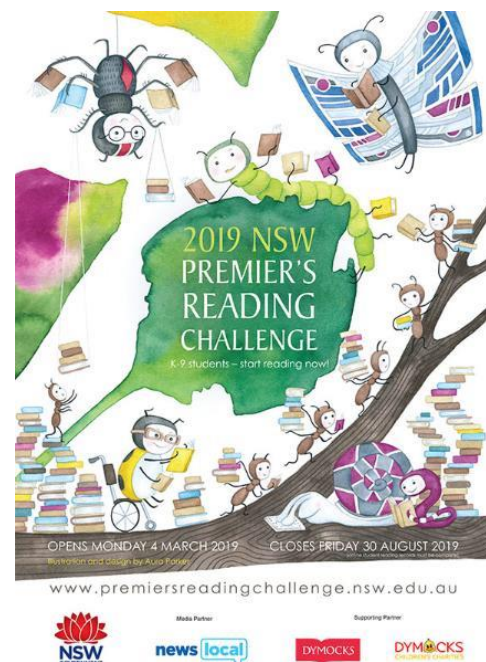
1. Click this link <https://online.det.nsw.edu.au/prc/home.html> it will redirect you to the NSW Premier's Reading Challenge home page.
2. On the PRC website homepage, click on Logon on the menu to login.
3. It will take you to the NSW Department of Education portal login page. Students will need to enter in their username and password here. Your child's teacher can provide user name and password if unknown.
4. Once logged on the page will state 'Personal Reading Record for ...(student's name)...'
5. Click on Student Reading Records (enter book) and you can start adding books.

TIP: If you enter the PRC ID number and press 'add' all the book details will appear. PRC ID numbers can be found on the last page of the book.

The library is open every morning from 8:30-8:55am and after school 2:55-3:15pm. If you need any assistance logging on please pop in and visit. Your child can also visit us at lunch time and our library monitors will help your child enter books. The library is open for K-2 second half play lunch Monday, Wednesday and Friday and 3-6 can visit the library second half play lunch Tuesday and Thursday.

The Premier's Reading Challenge has an exciting new feature that allows students to select a genre they enjoy and will offer a list of books to add to their wish list. Students in 3-6 will be exploring this new PRC experience during their library lessons. Happy Reading!

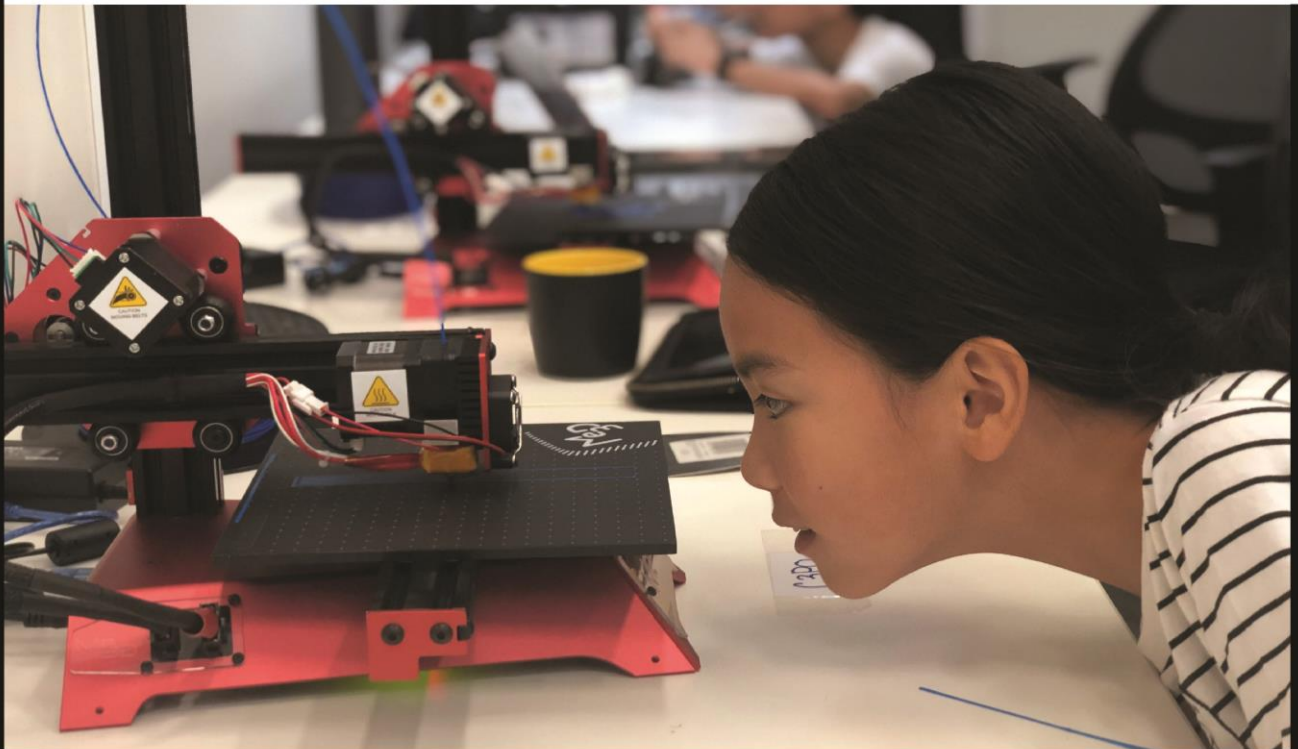

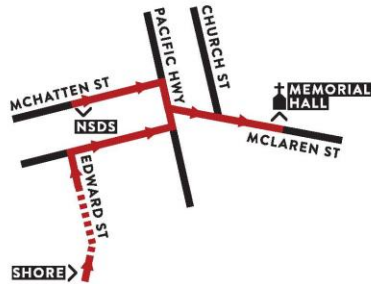
