## What is meant by giftedness and talent?

Gagné's (2003) *Differentiated Model of Giftedness and Talent* has been adopted by the NSW Department of Education's Gifted and Talented Policy (2004). This model provides us with a definition of giftedness and talent that have a connection to identification and curriculum programs.

*Gifted students are those whose potential is distinctly above average in one or more of the following domains of human ability: intellectual, creative, social and physical. Talented students are those whose skills are distinctly above average in one or more areas of human performance.*

Gagné suggests that up to 10% of the population may be gifted, encompassing a range of abilities, not only in the intellectual domain but also in creative and social areas. An important feature of the *Differentiated Model of Giftedness and Talent* is that there is a distinction between giftedness and talent. Giftedness becomes talent as a result of training and practice. A gifted person will not become talented without application. It is important to note that not all bright students are gifted, rather gifted students demonstrate a unique set of qualities and learning behaviours.

## Characteristics of gifted and talented students

Distinguishing features of the gifted become apparent from an early age. Silverman (1993) provides a useful generalisation of the intellectual and associated personality characteristics of the gifted group. Not all of these features are exclusive to gifted students, but such students possess them to a greater degree.

## Identification of Gifted and Talented students

At North Sydney Demonstration School (NSDS) we identify our Gifted and Talented students using a combination of subjective and objective data over a period of collection. All parents/caregivers and teachers have the opportunity to complete a nomination form if they feel a child demonstrates the characteristics of giftedness. These nomination forms will be referred to the Gifted and Talented Coordinator who will liaise with the Learning Support Team and School Counsellor. The Committee will then use existing data and administer general aptitude and reasoning testing (Years 1-6) to ensure appropriate identification of students. For a student to be identified as gifted they must meet the subjective and objective criteria.

## How can I tell if my child is gifted?

Agreement about what 'gifted' means is not easily reached, although it is generally accepted that a gifted student has the potential to perform in one or more domains of ability at a superior level, compared with students of the same age. Possible domains of ability are intellectual, creative, social and physical. A gifted student may demonstrate characteristics that are associated with giftedness long before he/she begins school. Research shows that, in the early years, parents and caregivers are the best judges of their child's abilities.

*Early predictors of potential in a gifted child may include:*

- curiosity
- advanced/refined development of either gross or fine motor skills
- quick assimilation of knowledge, early vocalising, and sentence complexity
- creativity in activities, including questioning and problem-solving

*Some or many of these attributes may be demonstrated in the following ways:*

- concentration and interest in reading, listening and writing
- interest in number and time concepts
- sophisticated sense of humour
- preference for the company of adults and older children
- accurate recall
- impatience with limitations, repetition and injustices
- superior organisational/categorising skills
- knowledge of cause and effect, and ability to make inferences at an early age

## How will identified students be catered for?

Students that are identified as gifted will be closely tracked and monitored by the Gifted and Talented component of the Learning Support team during their time at NSDS. Tracking of students ensures that there is a smooth transition as a student progresses through their school years by ensuring that appropriate learning and social provisions are in place. All identified students are placed with like-minded peers and their classroom teacher supports their learning through appropriate curriculum differentiation, compacting, personal learning projects and in some cases subject based acceleration where appropriate. For some identified gifted students, an Individual Learning Plan (ILP) may be developed. An ILP includes information about a student's previous testing and relevant data, current and future learning goals and areas for development or remediation.

Beyond the classroom, NSDS is able to provide a variety of enrichment opportunities including;

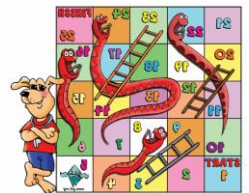

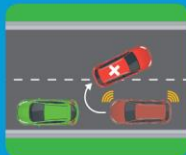


## Keep Children Safe – Do the Right Thing!

### Important safety rules to remember in school zones:

#### U-TURNS/THREE-POINT TURNS

These can be dangerous and difficult to manoeuvre and should be avoided.



#### DRIVEWAYS AND FOOTPATHS

It is illegal to park on or across driveways and footpaths.



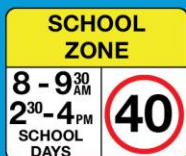
#### DOUBLE PARKING

Blocks visibility and forces other cars to go around you.



#### SPEEDING

A 40km/h speed limit applies in school zones.



#### NO PARKING ZONES

You can stop here for a maximum of 2 minutes and must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle. They are used as a drop-off and pick-up area.



#### NO STOPPING ZONES

You cannot stop in a No Stopping zone for any reason.



#### BUS ZONES

You cannot stop in a Bus Zone for any reason.



#### PEDESTRIAN CROSSINGS

You must not park on or too close to a pedestrian crossing.



#### MOBILE PHONES

It is illegal to use mobile phones while driving and the penalty for doing so in a school zone is substantial.



#### BUSES

Slow down to 40 when bus lights flash.



Children can be unpredictable, so expect the unexpected. Rules and parking signs are in place with children's safety in mind. Significant penalties apply for committing an offence in a school zone.

Why not reduce traffic and improve road safety around your school, as well as avoid the risk of a fine, and try walking all or some of the way to school?

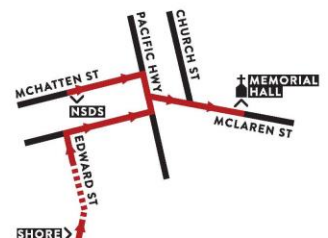
