Continuing with their work in their history unit, Year 5 are now excited for their 3-day Canberra camp excursion next week. NSW Premier's Reading Challenge 2019

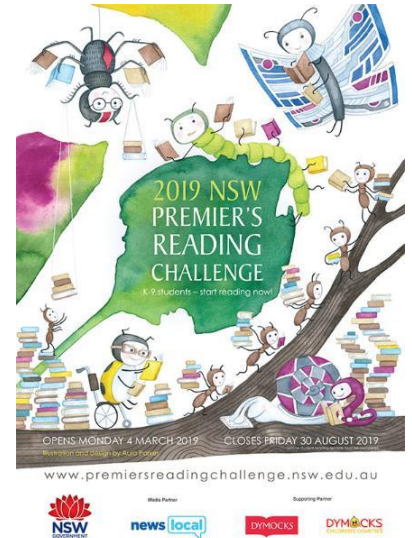

Congratulations to the 400 students that have completed the challenge and working hard to double it. Please send all double record sheets to the library by Friday 30 August.

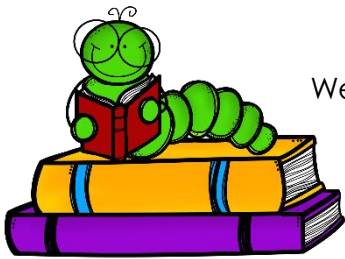
With only one week to go we encourage all students K-6 to participate in the challenge.

3-6 students will need to independently read 20 books.

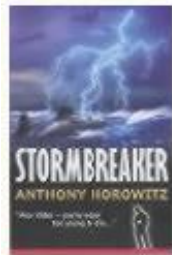


The PRC Sharing Space
